Employers: Government agencies (example: child protective services), correction facilities, precinct station houses, youth correction facilitates, halfway houses and pre-release programs, alternative schools, juvenile detention centers, non-profit organizations, medical centers, etc.

<u>Law:</u> Legal Aid, Legal Clerk, Legal Assistance, Legal Outreach, Legal Research, Judicial Clerk, Court Reporter, Appraiser, Investigator, Court Messenger, Administrative

<u>Federal Government:</u> Administrative, Foreign Services Officer, Border Patrol Agents, Criminal Investigator, Internal Revenue Officer, Forensic Science Technician

Employers: Government organizations (including sheriff's departments, correction facilities), crime labs, government troopers, US Customs and Border Protection, Prisons, Airports, Banks and retail organizations

Entry Level Jobs:

<u>Business:</u> Private Security, Surveillance, Loss Prevention, Property Loss Management, Staffing and Training, Auditing, Occupational Health and Safety Specialist or Technician, Claims Adjuster

<u>Protective Services:</u> Correctional Officer, Fire Inspectors and Investigators, Firefighters, Police, Detectives, Private Detectives and Investigators, Security Guards and Gaming Surveillance Officers, Forensic Science Technician
